Sally C. Pipes is President and Chief Executive Officer of the Pacific Research Institute, a San Francisco-Based think tank founded in 1979. In 2005, she was named one of the Top 10 Women in the Conservative Movement in America as published by Human Events. In 2008, she was honored by the California Women's Leadership Association. She received the 3rd Annual Women Achievers' award, "Celebrating the Spirit of Women." She was also featured in the 2005 book *Women Who Paved the Way* as one of 32 most outstanding women in business in the nation. Ms. Pipes, a Canadian-born naturalized United States citizen frequently speaks and writes to build the case against universal health care. She has addressed the false promise of a single-payer system as exists in Canada, pharmaceutical pricing, solving the problem of the uninsured, and strategies for consumer-driven health care. She authored the 2004 book, *Miracle Cure: How to Solve America's Health Care Crisis* and *Why Canada Isn't the Answer*. She has received numerous national honors and awards, has been guest speaker on most national television and radio networks, and has written many best-selling books including *The Truth about Obama Care*. On February 26th, we are truly fortunate to have her speak with us, receive her counsel and answer our questions on this critical issue for American citizens and our country.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND INTERNSHIPS

NFRW Scholarships and Internships

To involve more young women in the political process and to provide educational opportunities, the National Federation of Republican Women offers several scholarships and internships to female students.

The **National Pathfinder Scholarship** offers three annual scholarships of \$2500 to provide financial assistance and support to women seeking undergraduate or graduate degrees. Undergraduate sophomores, juniors and seniors, as well as students enrolled in a master's degree program are eligible to apply.

The **Betty Rendel Scholarship** offers three annual scholarships of \$1000 awarded to female undergraduates who are majoring in political science, government or economics and who have successfully completed at least two years of college coursework.

The **Dorothy Andrews Kabis Memorial Internship** gives female undergraduates the opportunity to spend part of the summer working at national headquarters in Alexandria, VA. Applicants must be at least a junior in college or a college student 21 years or older with a general knowledge of government, a keen interest in politics, campaign experience and sufficient clerical office skills.
