IF I WERE RUNNING

If I were running for supervisor, I'd pick issues on which to campaign, issues that the County Supervisors have bollixed. Among these issues are: unsustainable pension benefits, a county-wide computer system, and ownership of leased income property.

For years, the County Supervisors have undertaken propositions that led to major deficits. In turn, these shortcomings have forced reductions in staff and increases in sales taxes.

For example, the County's pension plan has been cut several times (but only for new employees) as the unfunded liability has grown enormously. "Unfunded liability" for pensions now exceeds \$300 million dollars, an amount that must be paid by taxpayers, not employees. Other defects in the plan include a bias toward higher paid employees by which ten percent of retirees received 30 percent of the benefits. Under current rules in California pension benefits may never be cut for public employees. Once an employee begins working his benefits for future work may never be reduced. The proposed Reed initiative would make it possible to change benefits for future service by collective bargaining. Yet the Supervisors not only do not support the Reed initiative, they refuse to encourage even a vote by the public.

Several years ago, the Supervisors approved design and installation of a new computer system that would embrace all departments. After years of development and soaring costs (\$35 million), the county gave up and sued the company responsible for installation. After at least two years of litigation and payment of \$5 million in legal fees, the County dropped the suit. Now the County is engaged in yet another expensive effort to design and install a new computer system. The results of this effort are unknown to date, but the rumors about its progress are not encouraging. Why does Marin need its own computer system? With 58 counties in California, all doing essentially the same work, it would seem a common system which is adaptable to local peculiarities (like multiple pension plans) would make good sense.

Finally, the County now owns and operates the McInnis golf and restaurant, having bailed out the original lessee who stiffed the County for two years' back rent. The County claims the golf course and restaurant are making money. Rather than take the "profits", it has agreed to undertake major renovations to the property.

So what is the platform?

1. Support the possibility of pension reform by encouraging citizens to become acquainted with the Reed initiative.
2. Require an update on the new computer system and if the prognosis is not favorable, shut it down.
3. Sell the McInnis golf and restaurant property.

MRWF's CAPITOL MUSE

I was in Grand Rapids Michigan when Obama delivered his SOTU diatribe against inequality in America, so this month's column compares that city's income with Washington D.C.'s.

Grand Rapids is the anchor of the surprisingly beefy economy of West Michigan. City residents personify a do-it-yourself culture of personal responsibility, which doubtless contributes to its relatively enviable 5.6% unemployment rate. Over time, Grand Rapids has nurtured several home-grown entrepreneurs who produced a disproportionately large share of the 600,000 new jobs America created last year. The city's "Medical Miracle Mile" includes world-class research facilities, and its native philanthropists have nurtured a vibrant atmosphere of culture, education and the arts. Manufacturing is the single largest segment of the area's economy, with educational/medical/social services a close second. By delivering products and services that people want to buy, Grand Rapids has pushed its median household income close to \$40K/year (cf. MI's \$34K, and the U.S.'s \$50K). Not bad compared to nearby Detroit's (\$26K), and considering that former Democrat Governor Granholm left Michigan's budget bathed in the red ink that is her Party's trademark.

Then there's Washington D.C., liberals' "shining city on a hill." Clustered within commuting distance of D.C. are all of the richest one-tenth of one percent of America's 3,000-plus counties. Gallup reports that in 2013 Washingtonians comprised the most economically confident population in the nation, with a Plus-19 confidence level that contrasts starkly with the nation's Minus-16. And why not? Their median household income level tops \$65K, and full-time Federal employees' individual median income tops a whopping \$74K.

There's virtually no industry in D.C., thus Washingtonians are immune to the plebian consumer demands that Grand Rapids' workers must satisfy daily. The Feds live in a competition-free zone: They hold a monopoly on their sole product—the laws, rules, regulations and Executive Orders under which the rest of us toil. Best of all, they don't have to produce a penny's worth of wealth—they simply confiscate it from the rest of us! (Talk about "You didn't build that"!)

So: The geographic seat of a Government "of, by and for the People" enjoys an annual income level that's nearly two-thirds higher than that of Grand Rapids' residents, and one-third higher than that of the American People generally. Yet Obama—Scourge of Fat Cats, Champion of Underdogs, Master Equalizer and Redistributist—feigns blindness to this.

Where's the outrage?
